Channel is a multi-agency approach to protect people at risk from radicalisation. Channel is about safeguarding adults and children and early intervention to protect and divert people away from the risks they face. 
# <u>Prevent Learning and Development – On The Road in</u> Warwickshire



WRAP Training took place in Rugby in January. This photo shows the work the group did on the Home Office Iceberg Analogy scoping out the grooming process and naming many of the terror attacks we could think of. The analogy shows how important Prevent is in the early identification of grooming and radicalisation in order to prevent extreme or terrorist attacks from taking place.



Warwickshire Young Carers paid due diligence in booking WRAP training for staff ensuring they are adhering to the Prevent duty. In groups we worked on the behaviours that everyone should be vigilant to if we thought individuals were being groomed or radicalised. Very important for the young people Warwickshire Young Carers staff work with.

Parents across the county are being encouraged to sign up to one of three sessions for the 'Prevent Online Grooming, Keeping Your Family Safe' training. These are:

- 1. A session organised for parents by a local school
- 2. A session running for parents in a local community centre
- 3. A session set up by an established community group who work with groups of parents already

Training offers parents an understanding of Prevent and how their children might be at risk of being groomed online. The Cyber Safe aspect explains to parents how to keep their children safe online, how to spot where the dangers might be for their children using the web, gaming sites or by using mobile phone apps. # Online Gaming Safety Conference 26th April 2018



At this free event, you will hear from Lorin LaFave, mother of Breck Bednar, and founder of The Breck Foundation, a charity that educates the Digital Generation to keep safe online. She campaigns for a safer internet and helps train police, educators, health practitioners, safeguarding leads, parents and pupils to ensure that young people are empowered to make safer choices for themselves online.

The event will help you find out more about what you can do to help protect yourself and your family from potential harms of online gaming.

We are holding two sessions in the day, primarily for school students in Years 7 & 8; Designated Safeguarding Leads and teachers. These will run from 10:30am-12:00pm and 13:00-14:00pm. ## 'Call to Active Citizenship' Course Begins

'Call to Active Citizenship' is a free course of evening lectures and presentations about being an active citizen. The purpose of the course is to inspire and inform residents in the Nuneaton and Bedworth Borough about good citizenship and how to get involved. The course covers twenty topics including setting up community groups, the role of councillors, function of councils, community safety, crime, planning and development procedures, and protecting the environment. Students will learn First Aid, about Prevent, extremism and terrorism, how to protect themselves and others from Cyber Crime and much more! After completion of the course, course members will be presented with a certificate at a special ceremony.

#### **Operation Dovetail and Channel Panel**

Channel Panel, the referral and support mechanism for Prevent has been in operation nationwide for 5 years. Over the last year the Home Office have been piloting a new method of running Channel Panels within Local Authorities. Warwickshire will be one of the final areas to be moved over to the new Channel Panel process possibly in December 2018? We await confirmation of how this new process will run.

#### **Pathways Training**

A Pathways training session was offered to secondary schools and colleges in Warwickshire on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> February 2018. Hifsa Haroon-Iqbal the West Midlands Regional Prevent Lead Further and Higher Education lead the session which offered a short film and teaching resources about a young Asian man and a young white man being radicalised towards opposing groups.
